The donor's blood pressure, hemoglobin level, and temperature were also checked before donating blood. Once the donor was deemed fit to donate, the blood was collected by a trained phlebotomist in a sterile bag. After the donation, the donor was given refreshments and advised to rest for a few minutes.

The doctors and the other council members thanked all the donors for donating blood to a noble cause. They also paid their sincere thanks to the NSS unit of BFCET for their cooperation in making this camp a resounding success and motivating the community for blood donation as it is an important for saving human life. Everyone left the camp with a smile on their face. Everyone had a general sense of pleasure and happiness. The blood donation camp was a success, The camp was able to collect 57 units of blood, which will be used to save lives in hospitals and blood banks. The camp also created awareness about the importance of blood donation, and many donors pledged to become regular donors.



In India, there is a need for time to strengthen global action and cooperation to achieve the goal of an international society free of Drugs. This one-day awareness seminar aimed to raise awareness to fight against substance abuse as well as the unlawful trade of drugs. It was an initiative taken by the NSS unit of Baba Farid College of Engineering & Technology to increase support for the prevention of drug use that is based on science.

On September 11, 2018, in Village Bhupal (Distt: Mansa), NSS volunteers organized an extension of their outreach program called the "Anti-Drug Awareness and Illicit Trafficking Seminar" in collaboration with Gram Panchayat (Village Bhupal). This was done as part of the "Nasha Mukh Bharat Abhiyan" initiative to educate the young generation about the negative effects that drug use has on both society and individuals. 




